

"From Shadow to Sun, Making Windcliff"

Dan Hinkley and his partner Robert Jones gardened in the shaded woodland of Heronswood for two decades. In 2000, they purchased 6.5 acres of exposed, southerly-facing property on a high bluff overlooking Puget Sound. Building a house and garden together at the same time, Windcliff has allowed Hinkley to explore those minions of the plant community that enjoy sun, heat and well draining soils. During this presentation, Hinkley will explain his reasons, methods and madness in creating this new garden.

She has written on gardening and garden design over the years for House & Garden, House Beautiful, Horticulture, Elle Décor, Fine Gardening, and Garden Design. She is the author of seven books, including Gardens in the Spirit of Place, the award-winning Breaking Ground: Portraits of Ten Garden Designers. and Inside Out: Relating Garden to House. Her first book, Duck Hill Journal, and her most recent, Embroidered Ground, are about Duck Hill in New York, where she lived and gardened for thirty-three years. She is the editor of Outstanding American Gardens and is on the Board of the Garden Conservancy, Stonecrop Gardens, in Cold Spring, NY, and Hollister House Garden in Washington, CT. She has recently been elected as an Honorary Member of The Garden Club of America. Page now lives and gardens with her husband in the company of assorted dogs in Falls Village, CT.

Ellen Ecker Ogden is the co-founder of The Cooks Garden Seed Catalog and author of numerous books including The Complete Kitchen Garden. Her articles and designs have appeared in magazines and newspapers including Martha Stewart Living, Horticulture, Eating Well,



The New York Times, and The Boston Globe. Her designs combine artistic elements with classic garden-design techniques that elevate a backyard vegetable garden into a European-inspired kitchen garden.

an Hinkley has introduced rare and unusual plants to gardeners of North America from the wilds of China, South and Central America and many other countries, numerous times a year for the past 22 years. He received the 2010 Book of the Year Award from the American Horticultural Society for his latest book The Explorers Garden: Shrubs and Vines from the Four Corners of the World. He has written for many magazines and won numerous awards. He currently resides in Washington where he is in the process of realizing his latest endeavor, the Gardens of Windcliff on a south facing bluff overlooking Puget Sound.
